

Game Notes: 1981 All-Star Game

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Rollie Gets Last Laugh

After Rollie Fingers had an All-Star Game to forget, he told reporters, “You don't want to make excuses, but I'm just not ready yet [after the strike].”¹ Fingers backed up his assertion the next day on the same mound, surrendering the tying run in the ninth as the Brewers opened the second half in Cleveland. But Fingers earned a save three days later against the Indians, and saved 16 of the Brewers 31 wins in the second half en route to a division “title” and the team’s first playoff appearance in franchise history. Fingers gave up just 3 runs in 37 and 2/3 innings after the All-Star Game, and went on to win both the American League Cy Young and MVP awards.

Fallen Angel

In six-plus seasons with the Boston Red Sox, Fred Lynn hit .308 with a .520 slugging percentage and .902 OPS. He won the Rookie of the Year and AL MVP awards in 1975, and finished fourth in MVP voting in 1979 despite posting statistics that were arguably better than the rest of the contenders (admittedly, the Red Sox finished third in the AL East, but they compiled a better W-L record than MVP Don Baylor’s California Angels, who won the AL West). However, on January 23, 1981, with an arbiter set to rule on whether Lynn was eligible for free agency, the Red Sox traded Lynn to the Angels for Frank Tanana, Joe Rudi, and Jim Dorsey after Lynn agreed to a four-year, \$5.4 million contract with the team that played its games just 10 minutes away from his California home. The Red Sox had been trying to trade Lynn for months; a deal with the Dodgers in December for a package including Steve Howe fell apart when Lynn refused to sign a new contract for longer than one season, and the Yankees turned down a proposed swap that would have sent Ron Guidry to Boston.²

Lynn had missed the last month of the 1980 season after fouling a ball off his right foot and breaking a toe, and his injury woes continued in 1981.³ Knee and arm injuries limited him to 44 games before the strike, and though he returned to the lineup the day after hurting his knee again in the All-Star Game, Lynn went 2-for-25 in his first six games of the second half, and proceeded to bat .131 after the break with just one extra-base hit (a double) and 6 RBI.

Bush and the Bandit

Vice President George Bush threw out the ceremonial first pitch at the All-Star Game. He had traveled to Cleveland on Air Force Two along with two special guests: Carl Yastrzemski and his son Michael. “It was an incredible experience,” the future Hall of Famer later told Peter Gammons. “He's a brilliant man, but he really knows baseball and loves to talk about it.”⁴ During the game, Bush sat in the stands near the American League on-deck circle alongside commissioner Bowie Kuhn, comedian Bob Hope, and former commissioner Happy Chandler (the seats were protected by a bullet-proof glass canopy installed for the event⁵). In the third inning, when “Morganna, the Kissing Bandit” ran onto the field to kiss Len Barker, NBC showed the group laughing, presumably at Hope’s humorous commentary about the buxom intruder. Morganna, who either evaded the extra security measures installed by the Secret Service, or was deemed not to be a threat, was quickly escorted from the field by police.

Past Production Does Not Guarantee...

Four players hit home runs in the 1981 All-Star Game, but that was hardly predictive of how they would perform during the rest of the season. Ken Singleton crashed dramatically back to earth, while Mike Schmidt cemented his second straight MVP award with a dominant second half. The changes in the statistics posted by Dave Parker and Gary Carter before and after the strike were less dramatic.

1981 All-Star Rosters⁶

While the timing of the All-Star game was unusual, one element remained the same: the traditional lamenting of the various “miscarriages of justice” committed during the All-Star selection process. All-Star voting by fans at Major League stadiums was truncated due to the strike, but continued at minor league parks.⁷ Davey Lopes and Bucky Dent were among the players that were deemed less than deserving of a starting nod, while the requirement to select one player per team tied the hands of managers Jim Frey (Kansas City) and Dallas Green (Philadelphia), forcing them to leave some talented personnel on the sidelines.

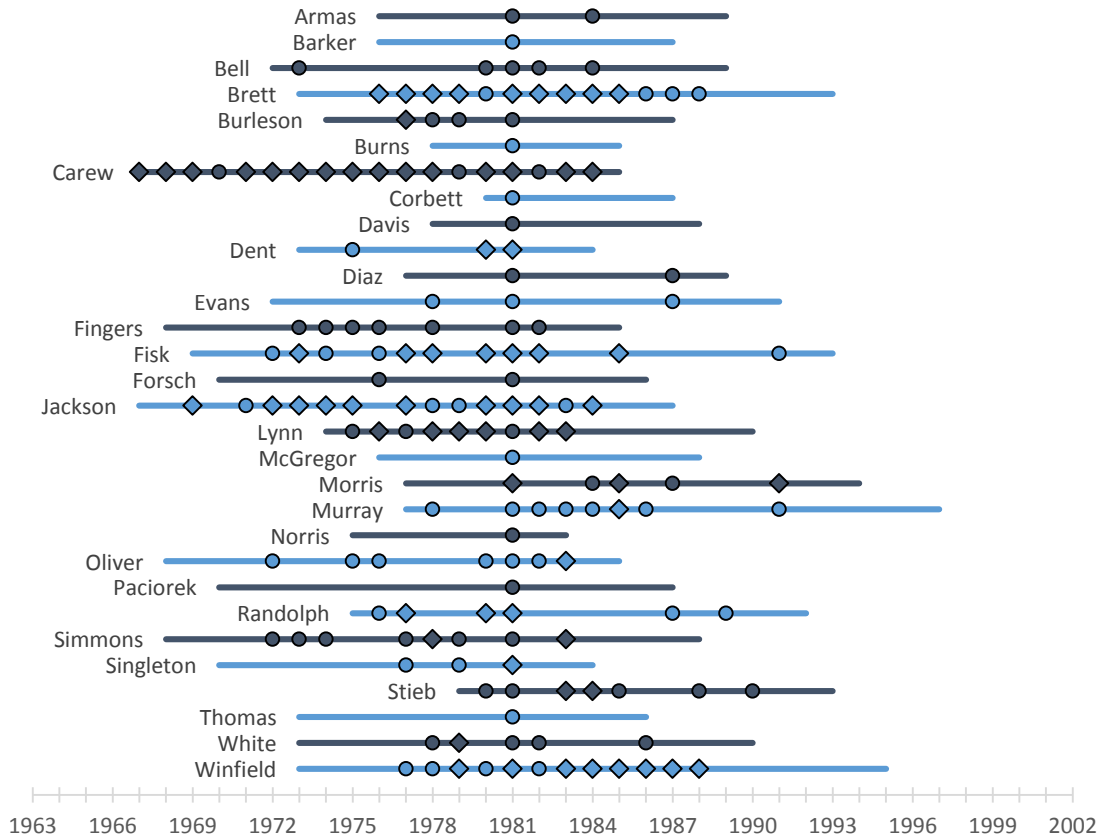

Career All-Star Appearances by members of the 1981 American League All-Star Team

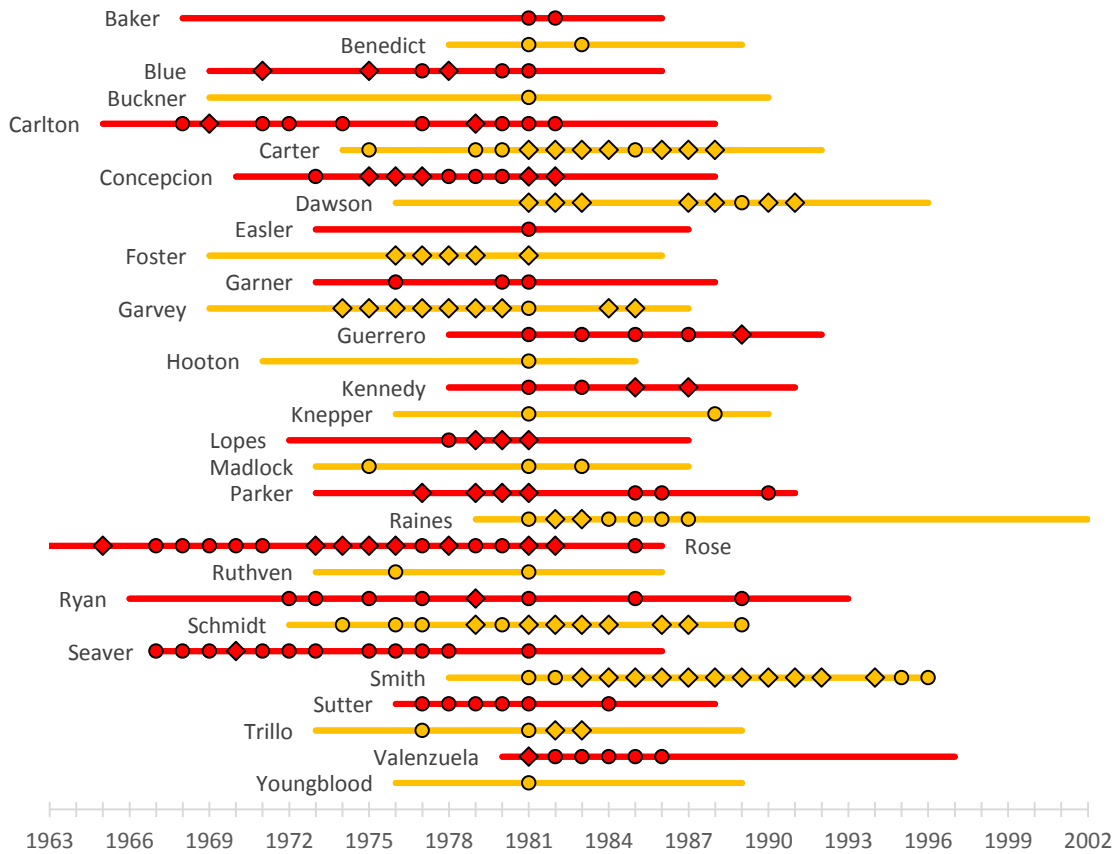

When the American League loaded the bases in the sixth inning, there were past or present Red Sox players at every base (Evans at third, Fisk at second, and Lynn at first) and former manager Don Zimmer was coaching at third. Even in the early days of the free agency era, players were changing teams more frequently, increasing the chances of this type of coincidence. Overall, there were 12 players and coaches at the game with Red Sox connections, either past, present, or future.
